One of the things we've enjoyed about being back in the US is the good Bible studies, Sunday school classes, and general Christian fellowship – in English – we've been able to appreciate. She's has attended a Women's Retreat in Costa Rica, Paraguay, & Chile – and now in the US. What a blessing to share God's love with other women.

The Mission Society had an official "inauguration" for us this month. We were welcomed & prayed over by the staff, and received as part of the extended staff of The Mission Society. It's good to have a place to officially "hang our hats"!

We also had the opportunity to attend cross cultural ministry training. The course is called "Jesus in the Qur'an", and was taught by a local, nondenominational church. We've attended many courses on cross cultural ministry, but it's always good to renew our focus. We addressed the issue of presenting the Gospel to Muslims. Jesus *IS* in the Qur'an, and our challenge is to present the Gospel in such a way as to lead Muslims to the Kingdom of God. We do not currently minister directly to a Muslim population, but these skills will be important as we work in Africa and India where there are significant Muslim populations.

We had the pleasure of hosting him in our home over the weekend, and learning lots about his host country. He told us if we are every in Africa – we MUST come to Togo. We're convinced and plan to visit both Togo and Ghana in September – God willing!

We were also introduced to another ministry in Africa, this was from Mozambique. We met with the US Directors and the African Directors of New Hope in Africa. They are beginning a water ministry to "Bring Clean Water to Those In Need". We hope to continue a dialogue with these good Christian folks as we continue our GRT work globally.
