Atlanta for just a day to unpack, and then Ed headed to Nicaragua. He attended a Board of Director's working retreat for Amigos for Christ. The group visited all the Amigos projects around Chinandega. He also had a chance to worship at the church we attended while we lived in Chinandega, and saw the project we helped to build at the Divino Niño church. Ed assists with many of the water projects of Amigos, and has helped to install a solar powered pumping system at the Amigo's farm. This system produces

10,000 gallons of water a day that is being used for irrigation.

While in Nicaragua, Ed met with our colleagues Ronnie & Angi Hopkins. We served with them during our 2 years in Nicaragua. The Hopkins have 2 projects we would like to help with, one in La Ballona, which is North of Chinandega, near the Pacific Ocean. The other project is at San Diego, up in the north central mountains, 20 miles from Honduras. La Ballona has a small public school in need of a drilled well with a hand pump. The San Diego community has a strong CHE program which has initiated the need for clean water. Their current well produces contaminated water, and should be replaced.
