In 2014 we have big dreams! We are working with an orphanage in Liberia, West Africa. The Executive Director of an orphanage in Liberia, Masa Gueh, touched our hearts as she spoke of the needs of the children she ministers to. We have spoken with Masa extensively regarding the needs of the children at the orphanage she has built and established. The kids at the Trinity Children's Center, near Monrovia, Liberia, are in need of good, clean water.
