the area. Luckily it is possible for a drill rig to get to the area and we are waiting for some quotes from nearby drillers. Please pray for this needed project.

Linda stayed in Managua the first week, helping Angi Hopkins. She had the pleasure of staying with Angi's Mom, Lotti Priester. Lottie is 92 years young, and born in Germany.
